## **Ō Mātau Wawata** What we want?

Tukuna te reo kia rere noa

#### **Priorities for investment:**

- Māori Language use and transmission in homes that will create opportunities to sustain Māori language domains beyond the home i.e. papa kāinga, marae and communities
- Providing information and awareness about Māori language.
- Developing ways that will support and engage people in language revitalisations (language planning).
- Developing ways to ensure iwi language revitalisation initiatives meet the needs of marae, hapū, and communities.
- Using (Māori language domains) te reo Māori along with unique Te Tai Rāwhiti dialectal variations.

# Our approach for iwi/regional language revitalisation:

**Kāinga** - reinstating language in the home.

**Auahatanga** - new and innovative ways of working.

**Ahikā** - investing in revitalisation initiatives that impact on the language of our region's tribes.

Targeted Locations 1,000 kāinga kōrerorero Marae: paepae, karanga, kāuta, hapori

#### Targeted Kaupapa

Interactions between kaumātua/mātua and tamaiti/tamariki Iwi dialect/forms/variants

A key investment area within our annual plan prioritises initiatives, activities, events, resources that focus on providing *Māori language usage* opportunities for Pou Tuarongo and Pou Tokomanawa stages:

- convert;
- retain;
- normalise.



## **Ngā Hua ka Puta** What will we see?

#### **Measures:**

- Increases in Māori language speaking homes;
- Kaupapa korerorero events that showcase iwi/hapu/marae reo;
- Existing and proven pathways to language use are increased;
- Inspirers are recognised (and this group is retained/grown)
- Support is provided to language leaders/champions;
- Increase in number of new initiatives;
- Increase in number of Pou Kaiāwhā, Pou Tuarongo, Pou Tokomanawa.

Total appropriation will be expended against investments that support *ahikā* reo revitalisation.
