### Ngā Hua me ngā Putanga Outcomes and measures

#### Pou Kaiāwhā:

Te Hunga Manawa Hikohiko - Tangata reo Māori (focus on individual language development of those new to te reo Māori)

- **Whāinga/Goals:** Tūwhitia te hopo, mairangatia te angitū – Feel the fear and do it anyway.
- **Hua/ Outcomes:** Kia whakapono, kia ngākaunui ki te ako ngā āhuatanga katoa o te reo Māori – Ignite the passion and desire to learn te reo Māori
- **Putanga/Target:** Kia mōhio te reo – Develop knowledge of te reo Māori.

#### Pou Tokomanawa:

Te Hunga reo whanake - Whānau reo Māori (focus on strengthening language capabilities and increasing use within whānau and homes)

- **Whāinga/Goals:** Kia māia ki te kōrero i te reo Māori, kia pakari ki te kōrero i te reo Māori – Strengthen language capabilities from conversational to proficient.
- **Hua/Outcomes:** Kia uru, kia whanake, kia ako i te reo Māori – Increased access to te reo Māori programmes that extend knowledge and understanding of te reo Māori.
- **Putanga/Target:** Kia mārāma ki te reo – Deepen the understanding of te reo Māori

### Ngā Aronga ā-Tahua Investment Priorities

#### Tūhonotanga – Connectivity

Initiatives that enable improved connection and transfer of intergenerational knowledge within whānau and communities across the sectors.

#### Auahatanga – Innovation

New and innovative national or multi-regional initiatives that offer a step change in increasing the availability and access of native reo Māori.

#### Toitūtanga – Sustainability

Continue to support proven initiatives that contribute to growing places and spaces where reo can be nurtured.

#### Pou Tuarongo:

Te hunga reo taketake - Hapori reo Māori (focus on connecting language expertise to marae, hapū and iwi to strengthen language communities and uphold cultural responsibilities)

- **Whāinga/Goals:** Kia papakāinga te reo ki te hinengaro, te wairua, te ao hurihuri anō hoki – Te Reo Māori is a first language for whānau and communities.
- **Hua/Outcomes:** Kia papakāinga te reo (Whakaaro Māori, Wairua Māori, Ōranga Māori) – Te Reo Māori is more than a communication tool, it is an expression of culture and identity.
- **Putanga/Target:** Kia kounga te reo, kia mau ki te mita o te reo – Increased quality of te reo Māori that supports the knowledge and use of dialect.
